For all non-emergency police issues please contact the Middletown Police Department directly Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. at 540-868-0535. Only leave a voice message at the Middletown Police Department if the return call is for administrative purposes or information only.

All non-life-threatening matters which require an officer please contact Frederick County non-emergency dispatch at 540-662-6162. If you have an emergency please call 911. All calls for service must first go through Frederick County dispatch. Frederick County dispatch will contact the officer/deputy on duty who will be handling the complaint. This will ensure that all calls are handled properly and in an efficient & timely manner.

Homeowners please remember if you are having work done at your home please make sure the business has a valid Town of Middletown business license. This helps ensure you are dealing with a legitimate business. And no one should be soliciting business door to door in the town without a Town of Middletown business license.

As always, all utility payments are due by the due date indicated and, if late, penalties will be applied. If the bill is not paid in full by the cut-off date, service will be disconnected for non-payment and there will be a \$100.00 cut-off/on fee added to your bill. There will be no payment arrangements. The Town will offer a onetime payment deferment on a case by case basis due to unforeseen circumstances. Reminder when you buy, trade, sell or dispose of a vehicle you must notify Frederick County 540-665-5681 extension 1. The Town of Middletown receives all billing information from Frederick County therefore they must have the correct information on file in order for the Town of Middletown to bill you correctly.

DMV stops have been issued. If you have not paid your personal property taxes please stop by the Town office before heading to DMV and pay your delinquent taxes so we can remove the stop. There is an additional fee of \$40 to remove the stop. The stop will not be removed until the entire balance is paid in full.

As a reminder, permits must be secured through the Town office prior to any work. All renovations to buildings need a zoning permit. All accessory buildings such as sheds and/or outside storage containers also need a zoning permit. When in doubt please call the office and speak with me. 540-869-2226 ext. 4

With spring fast approaching, please take a minute to review the Town's ordinance on grass, weeds or like vegetation as well as littering. When mowing or weeding it is unlawful to leave your grass clippings on the sidewalks and roadways.

Town Code section 6-2 / Duty of owners, etc., of premises - To cut and remove tall grass and weeds.

a. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, occupying of having charge of any real estate or an interest therein, located within the corporate limits of the town, where the parcel is one acre or less, to allow grass, weeds, or like vegetation grow on the property to a height of no more than 10 inches.

b. Parcels greater in size than one acre that lies within 25 feet of the right of way boundary of a public roadway (except for interstate highways) must also keep the grass, weeds or like vegetation to a height of no more than 10 inches.

c. If any owner, occupant or person in charge of such land or interest therein shall fail to have such illegal growth of grass or weeds on his land cut or otherwise removed within 7 days written notice of violation of this section, the town shall have the right to cut or remove such unlawful growth at the expense of the landowner, and such expense may be collected by the town as taxes are levied and collected. In addition, the owner shall pay a penalty of \$50.00 as a fine of this section.

d. Each day that any owner, occupant or person in charge of such land or interest shall fail to have such an illegal growth of grass or weeds on his land cut or otherwise removed after the above mentioned 7 days has run shall constitute a separate offense. Subsequent offenses in the same calendar year shall double until the fine reaches \$200.00. The fine per calendar year is capped at \$2000.00.

e. This section shall not apply to any land used for agricultural or industrial purposes.

Town Code section | 3-8 Littering

No person shall allow feces deposited by his/her animal to remain on any public highway, street, sidewalk, part of other public property, or on private property without written consent of the owner thereof or his agent.

Penalty – Any person who knowingly violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a littering infraction and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$25.00 per occurrence.

Please remember to be courteous and do your duty as a responsible pet owner and clean up after your pet(s).

Yard Waste pick-up will begin Monday March 30, 2020. And will end on Monday November 16, 2020. Please take a moment to review the yard waste guidelines. We will no longer pick up any yard waste that does not meet the required guidelines. Yard waste pick-up is every Monday, and must be curbside by 8:00 a.m. Yard waste consists of grass trimmings and leaves which CANNOT weigh more than 40 lbs. per bag. Branches or twigs can be **NO LONGER** than four (4) feet in length and **NO LARGER** than twelve (12) inches in diameter and must be <u>tied in bundles</u> (no wire or plastic string). Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable or paper yard waste bags only, no plastic bags. Yard waste should not be placed curbside until the morning of collection. This helps keep the community neat and free of clutter. Please never place the paper bags out in the rain the night before pick up.

We have begun renovations at the town park and the parking lot to help improve the site, please excuse our mess, as we complete these renovations. As always please pick up trash and place it in the trash cans provided around the park. Any problems or concerns at the park please see the contact information which is posted on the bulletin board at the park located near the bathrooms.

If you notice a street light out please contact the Public Works Department at 540-869-7731. Please provide the following information. Your name, your phone number, the street light address and the pole number if possible. We will then contact Rappahannock Electric regarding the outage.

Please make sure the water meter in your yard is free and clear at all times. The meter should never be covered or buried by anything. Please make sure the meter is not covered with grass, weeds, bushes, vehicles, boats, trailers, ice, snow etc. This can cause serious problems in the event of an emergency if we are unable to find and/or access the meter. The meter should be visible and most importantly easy to access. Please take the time to make sure the water meter in your yard is accessible at all times and clear from all debris and/or obstructions.

THE ANNUAL SPRING CLEAN UP WILL BE MONDAY APRIL 27, 2020 ALL ITEMS MUST BE PLACED CURBSIDE by 7:00 a.m.

THE COLLECTED ITEMS MUST BE LANDFILL ACCEPTABLE ITEMS, INCLUDING FURNITURE

IF IT IS NOT LANDFILL ACCEPTABLE IT WILL NOT BE PICKED UP

EXAMPLES OF NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS: APPLIANCES, TV'S, COMPUTERS, COMPUTER MONITORS, MICROWAVE OVENS, PAINT, HAZARDOUS WASTE, TIRES OR LAWN EQUIPMENT

REMINDER: PLEASE KEEP YARD WASTE SEPARATE. YARD WASTE SHOULD BE PLACED IN BIODEGRADABLE OR PAPER YARD WASTE BAGS ONLY ***NO PLASTIC BAGS***

Yard waste will be picked up by the Public Works Department. Spring clean-up items will be picked up by our trash service, Evergreen Waste Management. Please keep these items separate to ensure pick up.



New Residents: Welcome to the Town of Middletown

- Water billing is bi-monthly and is due on the 15th of the following months: February, April, June, August, October and December. It is important to pay your bill on time or by the cut-off date. If service is disconnected for nonpayment there is a \$50 cut-off fee and \$50 cut-on fee for a total of \$100.
- Trash service is provided through the town. Trash service is every Wednesday, curbside by 7:00 a.m. You must purchase your own trash can(s). No trash should be placed curbside outside of a trash can. No specific trash can is required. This is for regular household trash only.

Recyclables can be taken to the Frederick County Convenience Center located at 6671 Valley Pike, Middletown, VA 22645. And large items to the Frederick County Landfill located at 280 Landfill Road, Winchester, VA 22602.

- Please report all vehicles, motorcycles and trailers to the Personal Property Division of Frederick County at 540-665-5681 ext. 1. The town bills real estate and personal property taxes once a year due in December. The county bills taxes twice a year due in June and December. When you buy, sell, trade or dispose of a vehicle please report this information to Frederick County. We receive all real estate and personal property billing information from Frederick County. You will receive tax bills from both the town and the county.
- The town office is opened Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. (540)-869-2226
- Forms of payments accepted: check, cash, money order, debit or credit over the phone or in person there is a 3% convenience fee. Visa, Mastercard and Discover are accepted. No online payment at this time.
- Please visit the town's website at <u>www.middletownva.gov</u> for additional information for upcoming events, calendar of meetings, staff and town officials contact information, newsletter etc.
- Town meetings are held on the first, second and fourth Monday of every month. Work Session meetings are held on the first Monday of every month. Town Council meetings are the second Monday of every month. The Planning Commission meetings are the fourth Monday of every month. Every meeting begins at 7:00 p.m. and is held in the Council Chambers located in the town office at 7875 Church Street. Please enter at the rear of the building. The public is welcome at all meetings.
