From the Zoning Administrator

Town Code section 3-8

Permits must be secured through the Town office prior to the following: All renovations to buildings need a zoning permit. All accessory buildings such as sheds and/or outside storage containers also need a zoning permit. As well as pools that are deeper than 24 inches. When in doubt please call the office and speak with me. 540-869-2226 ext. 4

No person shall allow feces deposited by his/her animal to remain on any public highway, street, sidewalk, part of other public property, or on private property without written consent of the owner thereof or his agent.

Penalty – Any person who knowingly violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a littering infraction and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$25.00 per occurrence

Town Code section 6-2

a. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, occupying of having charge of any real estate or an interest therein, located within the corporate limits of the town, where the parcel is one acre or less, to allow grass, weeds, or like vegetation grow on the property to a height of no more than 10 inches.

b. Parcels greater in size than one acre that lies within 25 feet of the right of way boundary of a public roadway (except for interstate highways) must also keep the grass, weeds or like vegetation to a height of no more than 10 inches.

c. If any owner, occupant or person in charge of such land or interest therein shall fail to have such illegal growth of grass or weeds on his land cut or otherwise removed within 7 days written notice of violation of this section, the town shall have the right to cut or remove such unlawful growth at the expense of the landowner, and such expense may be collected by the town as taxes are levied and collected. In addition, the owner shall pay a penalty of \$50.00 as a fine of this section.

d. Each day that any owner, occupant or person in charge of such land or interest shall fail to have such an illegal growth of grass or weeds on his land cut or otherwise removed after the above mentioned 7 days has run shall constitute a separate offense. Subsequent offenses in the same calendar year shall double until the fine reaches \$200.00. The fine per calendar year is capped at \$2000.00.

e. This section shall not apply to any land used for agricultural or industrial purposes.

****FINAL DAY OF YARD WASTE PICK-UP WILL BE MONDAY NOVEMBER 13, 2017****

Reminder to please make sure the water meter in your yard is free and clear at all times. This is the property owner/tenant's responsibility. The meter should be visible at all times. Please remove any and all over growth including but not limited to; grass, weeds, bushes, etc. The meter needs to be clear of snow, and never blocked by vehicles, boats, trailers, etc. This can cause a serious problem in the event of an emergency if we are unable to find and/or access the meter. Please take the time to make sure the water meter in your yard is accessible.

We will no longer pick up any yard waste that does not meet the required guidelines. Yard waste collection is on Monday, and must be placed curbside by 7:30 a.m. Yard waste consists of grass trimmings and leaves which CANNOT weigh more than 40 lbs. Branches or twigs can be NO LONGER than four (4) feet in length and NO LARGER than two (2) inches in diameter and must be <u>tied in bundles</u> (no wire or plastic string). Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable or paper yard waste bags only NO PLASTIC BAGS. Yard waste should not be placed curbside until the morning of collection.

If you notice a street light out please contact the Public Works Department at 540-869-7731. Please provide the following information. Your name, your phone number, the street light address and the pole number if possible. We will then contact Rappahannock Electric regarding the outage.

Fire Prevention - Week 2017 October 8 – 14

In a fire, seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy.

That's why this year's Fire Prevention Week theme: "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" is so important. It reinforces why everyone needs to have an escape plan. Here's this year's key campaign message:

- <u>Draw a map of your home</u> (PDF) with all members of your household, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.
- Practice your home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in your home, and practice using different ways out.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- Make sure the number of your home is clearly marked and easy for the fire department to find.
- Close doors behind you as you leave this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.
