We are here to protect and serve the citizens of Middletown and surrounding communities.

VDOT will soon adopt the roadways in the Village at Middletown. We will start enforcing traffic violations, parking regulations, speeding, no parking. etc. Please be aware and comply at all times to avoid being ticketed.

Please remember when mowing your grass to NOT leave grass clippings or debris on the sidewalk or streets. This is for the safety of our motor cyclists along with water runoff and clogging the storm drains. We are still finding a lot of residents in violation of this ordinance. (Middletown Town Code § 6-1)

Trick or Treat will be held on Sunday October 31, 2021 from 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. If you will be passing out candy, please make sure your front porch and walkway areas are well lit to ensure everyone's safety. Please be aware and courteous when driving through town. We strongly encourage adult supervision for children at all times to avoid any incidents. Flash lights and reflective clothing are always a great idea when walking at night.

No handheld devices while driving, Virginia Law effective January 1, 2021. Phone Down. It's the Law. A person who violates 46.2-818.2 is subject to a fine of \$125 for the first offense and \$250 for the second and subsequent offenses. In the event that you are pulled over for holding a handheld personal communications device, act in the same manner you would for any traffic stop. You will not be asked to hand over your device. Keep in mind that what you are doing with the device is irrelevant, it is the act of HOLDING the device while driving that is illegal.

All non-life-threatening matters which require an officer please contact Frederick County non-emergency dispatch at 540-662-6162. If you have an emergency, please call 911. All calls for service must first go through Frederick County dispatch. Frederick County dispatch will contact the officer/deputy on duty who will be handling the complaint. This will ensure that all calls are handled properly and in an efficient & timely manner.

The town offers online payments for your convenience. Have your bill handy because you will need your account number in order to get started. Once there you can register your account and set up the many features that make paying your bill(s) easy such as automatic and recurring payments, text and email reminders, paperless statements, etc. You may also pay over the phone, available 24/7 by calling (855)844-0226. If you need assistance registering your account, please feel free to contact the town office.

Homeowners, please remember if you are having contracted work done at your home such as landscaping, roofing, plumbing, electrical, additions, fencing and decks, etc., please make sure the contractor(s) has a valid Town of Middletown business license. This helps ensure you're dealing with a legitimate business and if recourse needs to be taken, we have information on file for the business that we can provide to you. No one should be soliciting business door to door in town limits without a Town of Middletown business license.

As always, all utility payments are due by the due date indicated or by the cut-off date. If the bill is not paid in full by the cut-off date, service will be disconnected for non-payment and an additional fee of \$100 will be added to your account that must be paid before services are restored. Cut-off \$50/cut-on \$50. If you have any questions, or need assistance paying your bill please contact the town office. Please call before the account is past due.

Last day of Yard Waste Pick-Up will be Monday November 15, 2021. Yard waste that does not meet the required guidelines will not be picked up. Yard Waste must be curbside by 7:30 a.m. Yard waste consists of grass trimmings and leaves which CANNOT weigh more than 40 lbs. Branches or twigs can be NO LONGER than four (4) feet in length and NO LARGER than twelve (12) inches in diameter and must be <u>tied in bundles</u> (no wire or plastic string). Yard waste must be placed in biodegradable or paper yard waste bags only NO PLASTIC BAGS. Please do not place curbside until the morning of collection. This prevents rain soaked bags and helps keep the community neat and free of clutter along our roadways.

If you notice a street light out, please contact the Public Works Department at (540)869-7731. Please provide the following information. Your name, your phone number, the street light address and the pole number if possible. We will then contact Rappahannock Electric regarding the outage.

Please make sure the water meter on your property is free and clear at all times. This is the property owner/tenant's responsibility. The meter must be visible and accessible at all times in the event of an emergency.

Fall is upon us and camping season will begin, per Town Code all travel trailers, and the like, need to be stored only within the minimum rear yard requirements. (Middletown Town Code § 17-6-A) In addition it shall be unlawful for a camper or travel trailer to be parked on any street or alley of the town for more than twenty-four hours. (Middletown Town Code § 8-10)

When out on your walks with pets please be considerate and pickup waste. It is unlawful to allow feces deposited by his/her animal to remain on any public highway, street, sidewalk, part of other public property, or on private property without written consent of the owner thereof or his agent.

Penalty – Any person who knowingly violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a littering infraction and shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$25.00 per occurrence. (Middletown Town Code § 3-8)

Any projects that might be underway may need a Zoning Permit. Please feel free to call the office to discuss if a permit is necessary as this will assure that nothing is built on an existing easement as well as getting the necessary inspections.

Signage cannot be placed in any State-maintained right of way. State-maintained right of way is property along a roadway on either side. This area does not belong to individual property owners. It must be kept clear for motorist safety and so road crews have room to work. (VA State Code § 33.2-1224)
